A genetic counseling and testing program for Adult-Onset Leukoencephalopathy with Axonal Spheroids and Pigmented Glia (ALSP)

InformedDNA®, with support from Vigil Neuroscience, Inc., is providing no-cost genetic counseling and testing to individuals with a family history of Adult-Onset Leukoencephalopathy with Axonal Spheroids and Pigmented Glia (ALSP).

ALSP is a hereditary (i.e., runs in families) neurologic condition caused by a change (also called a mutation or variant) in the *CSF1R* gene. The symptoms of ALSP can be very similar to many other psychiatric and neurologic conditions, for example Alzheimer's disease or multiple sclerosis. This makes it difficult to make an accurate diagnosis based on clinical symptoms alone. A genetic test can identify whether an individual has a mutation in the *CSF1R* gene, which is the cause for ALSP, and help to confirm the diagnosis of ALSP.



Who is eligible for this program?

- ✓ Adults (18 years or older), AND
- ✓ Live in the United States, AND
- ✓ Have a family history of ALSP



What is genetic counseling?

Genetic counseling is the process of helping people understand and adapt to the medical, psychological and familial implications of genetic contributions to disease. This process integrates the following:

- Interpretation of family and medical histories to assess the chance of disease occurrence or recurrence.
- Education about inheritance, testing, management, prevention, resources and research.
- Counseling to promote informed choices and adaptation to the risk or condition.



What to expect in a genetic counseling appointment with InformedDNA®

The genetic counselors at InformedDNA® working on this program are highly trained in hereditary neurological conditions. As part of this program individuals will receive initial and post-test genetic counseling over the phone.

At the initial appointment, the genetic counselor will:

- ✓ Collect medical history and a 3-4 generation family history where available;
- ✓ Discuss the genetics of ALSP;
- ✓ Review the benefits and limitations of genetic testing;

If you decide to proceed with genetic testing, then the genetic counselor will coordinate the test order and sample collection kit to be sent to you (cheek swab)

- ✓ Results will be available in approximately three weeks from when the lab receives the sample back from you

At the post-test appointment, the genetic counselor will:

- ✓ Review the genetic test result and implications for personal health and risks to family members
- ✓ Provide a written summary of the discussion and a copy of the genetic test result to the individual

All appointments occur over the phone. Family members or friends may participate in the call, regardless of location. Appointments are available during usual business hours as well as evenings and weekends.
